Outstanding needs of the 1.5 million people affected by floods in 2013 are being monitored.

1.02 million people remain displaced in KP/FATA due to insecurity

1.4 million people have returned to FATA since 2009

592,648 Afghan refugees

170,417 registered families with more than 1 million individuals are currently displaced in Kyber Pakhtunkhwa and the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) as a result of ongoing insecurity since 2008. More than 1.4 million people have returned to FATA since 2009.

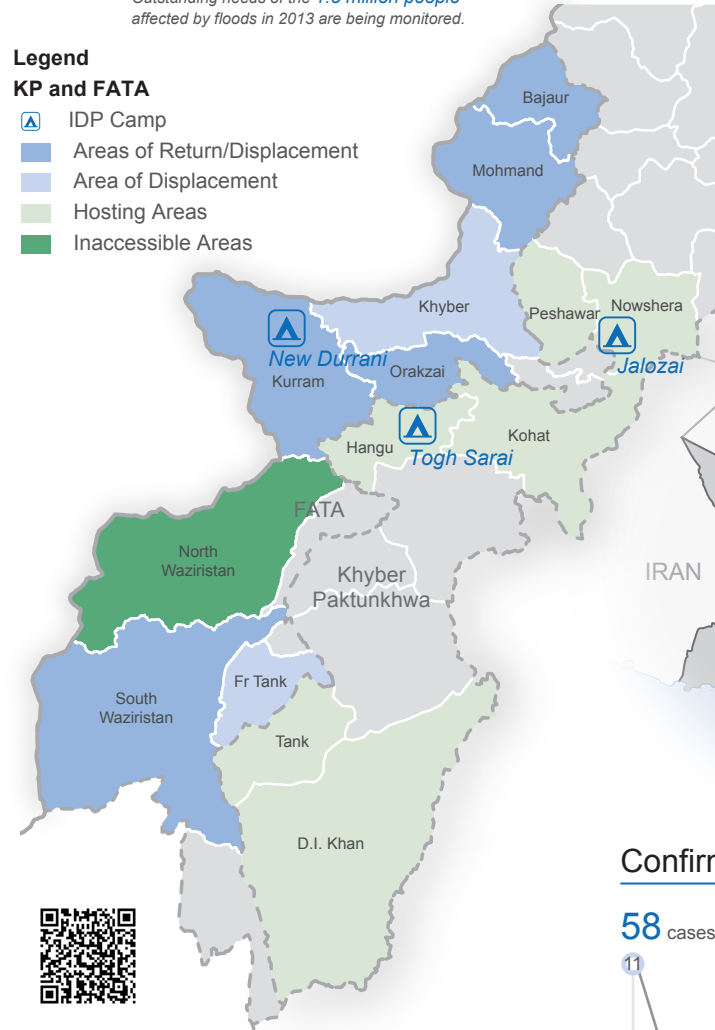
1.62 million Afghan refugees remain in Pakistan of whom UNHCR assists 592,648 refugees in the 81 refugee villages.

1.5 million people have been affected by recent floods in 2013 (NDMA).

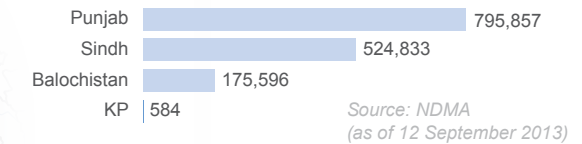

- Flood affected areas 2013



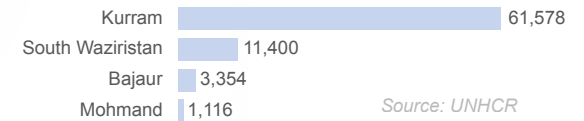
## Floods affected people in 2013

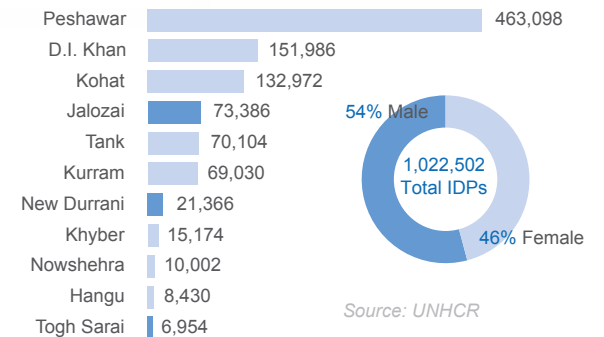
## FATA IDP returns in 2013

77,448 Total IDPs



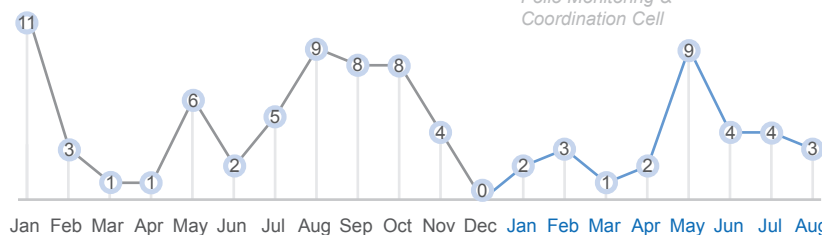
## KP/FATA number of registered IDPs
