
NEPAL: SOAR & UDAAN

Overview

Added Youth Savings and Loan Associations (YSLAs) to education programming in Nepal to overcome financial barriers to attending school and encourage a habit of saving.



Results

Out of school girls **rejoined the education system** and **started new businesses**.

Having savings has boosted **girls' aspirations** for what they can achieve in the future.

Girls increased their self-perception of their **potential as leaders**.

81%

Of girls plan to use their savings to support continuing their studies.*

62%

Of girls participated in campaigns within the community to raise awareness of gender-based violence.*

Which aspects contributed to gender transformative impact?

- Community sessions based on the Tipping Point model promote gender dialogue in the community and engage fathers to gain family support for girls and raise awareness of social norms affecting them.
- Girls' groups plan girl-led collective action to address harmful and discriminatory social norms.
- Religious leaders, school teachers and other male community leaders are engaged in support of girls' education and empowerment.
- Community campaigns raise awareness of gender-based violence.
